The five experiments are: (N stands for the total number of subjects involved in the experiment.)

Experiment 1 - N-18 - Hypnotically induced anxieties to be completed by September 1.

Experiment 2 - N-24 Hypnotically increasing ability to learn and recall complex written matter, to be completed by September 1.

Experiment 3 - N-30 Polygraph response under Hypnosis, to be completed by June 15.

Experiment 4 - N-24 Rypnotically increasing ability to observe and recall a complex arrangement of physical objects.

Experiment 5 - N-100 Relationship of personality to susceptibility to hypnosis.

There follows a brief chronological relation of the events of the week of 21 March 1954:

22 March - Mr. established in a suite in the Rotel. 12 volunteer subjects were screened for successfullity.

23 March - Seven subjects were screened for suggestibility in the forenoon.

> In the aftermoon the three subjects scoring highest on suggestibility screening returned for one hour individual interviews with Mr.

Each subject was given the attached information report to study for 1/2 hour with instructions to remember the contents.

24 March - Each subject spent one hour in the morning And one hour in the efternoon with Nr. Jun. / Inmediately prior to the afternoon appointment each subject was allowed to observe a hotel room for one minute under instruction to remember all features for later relation.

25 March - One hour was spent with each of the subjects in the morning. In the aftermoon each subject was saked to reproduce conceiously the written raterial studied and the features of the observed roca. Following this and in the presence of CO/TSS Personnel, each subject was hypotized, and reproduced, while in trance, either the written or observed material.



26 March - A demonstration was given for selected representatives of Senior Staffs and Area Divisions. Limb catalegay, reproduction of written material and visualization and verbal description were demonstrated.

Discussion:

At all times when subjects were being hypnotized a CD representative (Dr. Gottlieb or Major (1997)) was present. His presence served a double purpose of reassurance to the subject and observation of technique for possible later exploitation.

It should be emphasized that from the hymotist's point of view the entire operation was certific out under the most difficult conditions. He had no previous contact with subjects, hence, no initial rapport existed. He had no background knowledge of subjects from which to develop leads indicating depth of trance. It is an established fact that trance depth develops most satisfactorily if time (a few days) is allowed between interviews. Here subjects took part in four developmental interviews within a perd of 18 hours thus allowing-very little assimulatory time.

Despite the difficulties under which he worked, Mr. was able to demonstrate medium trance phenomena quite satisfactorily.

With respect to techniques used by Mar in auggestibility testing and hypnosis, the methods are essentially as follows: A constant speed black on white spiral color wheel was used for visual fixation along with verbal suggestion in initial testing. With those subjects denostrating susceptibility, suggestions were made that future trance induction would be accomplished on verbal occumend to sleep. In later interviews verbal suggestions and commands were given with a background of metronous beats.

Results:

As indicated previously three subjects were chosen for further development. Results of the each subject will be treated asparately. Subject A *** trained a medium trence state. In the short time for development, however, he was unable to reach a sommentibulistic state as characterized by namesia. In the preliminary demonstration subject A demonstrated arm catalogmy and hypnotic recall of written material. In the final demonstration Subject A demonstrated arm peralysis and induced pain as a form of physical and psychological control. Subject 3 atteined medium trance state and in both demonstrations produced under hypnosis a quite occurate copy of written material proviously observed. Unfortunately both A and B proved to have excellent memories. They were able to recall the raterial quite accurately without hypnosis so that little, if any, improvement could be noticed.

Subject 0 with atteined medium trance state with a particular floir for visualization and verbelization. In the preliminary demonstration "0" reproduced the layout of the room observed noting additional features and correcting erroneous relationships evident in a previous conscious recounting. 

Comments:

Whereas the experiment was only partially successful in the light of failure to schieve semesiae states and the lack of marked improvement in bypnotic recall, the interest aroused among observers of the deconstration attests to the success of one of the main objectives--stimulation of thinking in the operational fields.
